3.9 2024/2025 Budget Resolution (Exhibit #17)

A motion was made by Kim Strauser, seconded by James Moyer, to approve the resolution certifying that the 2024/2025 tax rate will be increased at a rate at or below the adjusted Act 1 index for our district, as outlined in Exhibit #17. Mrs. VanSchaick noted that although the 2024/25 Adjusted Act 1 Index is 7.8%, PA Statute 6926.327 notes that in the year following a county wide re-assessment, the Act 1 Index from the previous year (6.1%) applies rather than the index from the current year. Roll Call Vote. All votes were affirmative. The motion carried.

3.10 Approval to Purchase Auto Scrubber for Williamson High School

A motion was made by Greg Cummings, seconded by Craig Stage, to approve the request to purchase a Tennant T290 Auto Scrubber for Williamson High School at a cost to the district of \$5,000.00. This is being purchased with remaining funds from the skid steer bucket and forks that was approved in the 2023/24 equipment list and came in under budget. Roll Call Vote. All votes were affirmative. The motion carried.
