5.1 2024/2025 Budget Update

•Act 1 Budget Timeline

May 31, 2024 - Adopt Proposed Final Budget

June 30, 2024 – Adopt Final Budget

•Preliminary Budget Revenue Information

Adjusted Index is 6.1% for Northern Tioga which equates to 0.5768 mills or approximately \$657,502.40 in increased tax revenue

2018-19 Increase was 2.69%. Less than adjusted Act 1 Index of 3.5%

2019-20 Increase was at the adjusted Act 1 Index of 3.4%

2020/21 - No Tax Increase

2021/22 - No Tax Increase

2022/23 – Increase was 4.0%. Less than the adjusted Act 1 Index of 5%

2023/24 – Increase was 3.211%. Less than the adjusted Act 1 Index of 6.1%

•State Budget for 2024/25

Governor Shapiro presented his proposed budget on February 6, 2024. Included in his proposal:

Basic Education Funding \$200 million increase for the BEF formula
New Adequacy Investment Formula driven into the BEF Base of \$871 million
Special Education Funding \$50 million increase
\$50 million in safety and security grants for physical safety through PCCD
\$100 million in mental health grants through PCCD
\$300 million school environmental repair projects
Statewide Cyber Charter Tuition Rate of \$8,000.00/student.
Increase to the Minimum Wage from \$7.25 to \$15.00/hour

What does the PROPOSED budget equate to for Northern Tioga?

- ---Basic Education Funding increase \$1,941,008.00 over 2023/24 allocation
- ---Special Education Funding increase \$66,457.00 over 2023/24 allocation
- ---No Increase in Ready to Learn Block Grant
- ---Vocational Educational Funding increase \$13,410.00

Important to remember that this is a PROPOSED budget.

•Federal Revenue

No projections for 2024/25 yet

•Expenditure Information – that is known at this time

---PSERS Retirement Rate is 33.99%, down from 34.00% last year. Please note that employer contribution rates are projected to increase in the following fiscal year and beyond. Estimated projections are listed below:

2025/2026 - 34.72% 2026/2027 - 35.41% 2027/2028 - 35.94% 2028/2029 - 36.53% 2029/2030 - 37.15% 2030/2031 - 37.78%

⁻⁻⁻Support Staff Salary Increases \$232,989.00

⁻⁻⁻Act 93 Salary Increases \$57,560.00

---BC/BS Health Insurance Tentative Increase of 6.5% is \$348,125.00. Rate will be finalized at the February 28th meeting.

---Professional Contract is under negotiations.
